

The title of the project is "Sustainability starts on you(th)!".

The concern or the topic of this project is the examination of possibilities of a sustainable lifestyle.

The project is carried out by four European countries, which together investigate and develop sustainable concepts.

The participants / our partners are:

- Lycée d'enseignement général et technologique Frantz Fanon (Frankreich, Martinique)
- Institut Antoni de Martí i Franquès (Spanien, Tarragona),
- Strokovni izobrazevalni center (**Slowenien**, Ljubljana)

In this EU-financed cooperation project with European partner schools, under "normal" conditions, pupils and teachers organize trips to the respective countries to exchange ideas during joint activities such as presentations, workshops, blogs, visits and other entertaining events.

With this project work we would like to make our students aware of common values and promote a responsible and sustainable behaviour.

The cooperation between teachers and students from our partner schools and their exchange with local institutions improves language and intercultural skills and promotes a better understanding of how a sustainable lifestyle can work. Since exchange trips could not have taken place under the given circumstances of the pandemic, the usual presentations of the respective partner teams with information on the school, city, region and basic data on the country were prepared and information on other project-related topics such as nature reserves, water consumption and recycling was collected.

In order to cheer up all project participants under the current pandemic restrictions, we relaized a package campaign. We sent sustainable, possibly local and homemade articles with a small personal message to show that we are all waiting to finally meet our partners in real life and that we are not giving up thinking about our project topic. This is how we received a wide variety of products and the first "tangible contact".

Furthermore, a project logo competition was held and the participating students received a sweatshirt with our project logo, which can be worn on trips and visits that will hopefully be realized soon.

At the end of the year, our students dealt with the topic "A greener Christmas" and thought about how to spend a more sustainable and environmentally friendly Christmas season.

Millions of trees cut down, mountains of rubbish made from wrapping paper, chains of lights that consume electricity. This can be counteracted and our students collected ideas and tips on how to celebrate Christmas in a more resource-saving way. Ideas for gift packaging, for example from old atlases, were also made and everything was presented to the students of our high school during the breaks. At the same time, in order to get a general picture of our students' attitude and their perception of the subject of "sustainability", suggestions and tips for a more

sustainable lifestyle and wishes for a more sustainable approach at our school were asked for in a mutual exchange. These results will be evaluated further elaborated on according to focal points.

Now we hope to be able to realize at least our planned trip to the climate house in Bremerhaven with a FROSTA cooking workshop, in which our students deal with seasonal and regional products and other aspects of a climate-friendly and healthy nutrition.
